What is Investing in Children?

1995 – Created by a partnership between Durham County Council and the NHS.

2004 allow IiC services

Investing in Children Development Agency was created in to to work with other public across the UK.

2013 - Investing in Children became an independent Community Interest Company.



Our Vision

- Children and young people possess the same rights as the rest of humanity.
- Young people experience a better quality of life in society.
- The services young people access recognise and respect their human rights.





values & Principles

- Children and young people are citizens-'lived lives'
- As citizens, all children and young people have the right to be involved in decisions that affect them
- This places a responsibility on agencies to open up their processes and engage children and young people in dialogue
- Participation differs from consultation



What do we do?

- liC creates opportunities for children and young people to become genuine participants in decision making processes
- IiC works with public sector organisations to promote and engage in dialogue with children, which lends itself to a real change in policy
- We provide the platform for children and young people to share their ideas for creative and supportive projects.





The Concept of Dialogue

- Everyone has the right to their say
- Everyone must be listened to with respect
- Everyone deserves to have their claim considered
- There must be no coercion
- The force of the better argument

Theory of change

- Children and young people understand their circumstances, known as their 'lived lives'
- Engaging young people in dialogue is aimed to develop improvements in their 'lived lives'.
- Enabling, respecting and including children is their democratic right.

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


