    - Acting as applicants alongside researchers on funding grants
    - Offering advice and feedback as a member of a project's steering group/research team
    - Reviewing documents
    - Helping to develop materials such as information sheets, interview guides or questionnaires
    - Carrying out interviews/taking part in focus groups with research participants
    - Analysing data
    - Writing up research findings
    - Helping to share research findings and get research evidence into practice.

- Co-authoring papers, articles or reports
- o Writing blogs or content for ARC website & social media
- Representation at a governance level across the ARC (Stakeholder Board, Executive Board, Implementation Advisory Group, EDI Group etc.)
