What the ARC Young People's Advisory Network expect from researchers

- Updates on the progress and outcomes of the research, and information about follow
- Documents sent by email at least 48 hours before a meeting, size 14 font with a limited use of graphics
- The ability to
 Specification of what young raise concerns people researchers is looking for e.g., young people with experience of autism pharmacy, foster care etc.
 - Minimum 2 weeks' notice for meetings (between 2-4 weeks depending on time of year e.g., exam time, holidays).
 - The ability to choose how we receive payments
 - Clarity about the background of research e.g., who is funding it, who is involved etc

What researchers can expect from the ARC Young People's Advisory Network

- Giving opinions on research in our own way e.g., in the online chat, verbally, after the meetings via email
 - Enthusiasm and involvement with research
 - Having experience of designing/participating in research
 - A diverse range of young people (age, ethnicity, socio-economic status, gender, geographical location)
 - Range of young people with a variety of experiences and expertise
 - Prompt timekeeping and informing researchers of who will be in attendance
- Politeness and curiosity we do enjoy participating!

- Response within 3 working days
- Treatment of research, researchers, and young people with integrity and confidentiality
- Attendance at 1-hour meetings (maximum) with short introductions and names as opposed to icebreaker
 - Deadlines given and agreed on an individual basis
- Choice to have cameras off during online meetings
